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## WRHA Safe Handling of Hazardous Medication – Reference Documents

The Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA) Pharmacy Program and CancerCare MB have developed useful reference documents outlining safe handling protocols for hazardous medications. The <a href="https://www.wr.energy.org/wr.

If a patient is unable to swallow a hazardous medication, the patient should contact the cancer clinic for advice on alternate dosage forms or if the medication can be safely manipulated to an acceptable form. The Enteral Dosage Forms of Hazardous Medication chart lists the oral dosage forms available for cytotoxic and non-cytotoxic medications. It also indicates if a medication can be compromised and through which method – dissolve and dose or crush or dissolve and dose. The WRHA has developed detailed instruction sheets for staff and patients on the proper procedures for each method. Specific procedures must be followed to protect the patient and others from topical or inhalation exposure to toxic powder. Any change in dosage form should be on the recommendation of the cancer clinic pharmacy however the community pharmacy should be made aware of the new directions and the process the patient is using.
