Proposed Changes to the Electronic Transmission of Prescriptions
Practice Direction and the Manitoba Prescribing Practices Program (M3P)

## **Background**

Since the summer of 2021, the College of Pharmacists of Manitoba (CPhM) has been working closely with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba (CPSM), and other regulatory Colleges to review many aspects of prescribing-related legislation and Standards of Practice.

This review has been brought to the forefront by the COVID-19 pandemic, the advent of virtual medicine, and the increasing number of new modalities and technologies available for prescribing. Through this collaborative work, changes to joint Practice Directions and the Manitoba Prescribing Practices Program (M3P) have been proposed.

This consultation provides an opportunity for all registrants and other interested parties to provide feedback, which will inform the Council's final decision-making process.
