This is designed for care and service providers and staff who engage directly with clients, patients, and their families.</p> <p>The “Indigenous gender diversity: Creating culturally relevant and gender-affirming services” course is for those who work in health and social service settings to increase their awareness, knowledge, and skills when improving service access for gender diverse Indigenous people.</p> <p>The “Supporting gender creative children and their families” course is for those who work with children and their families. It describes 6 qualities of an inclusive pharmacy, including knowledge of key LGBTQ terms, inclusive communication, gender-related data management, visible symbols of support, staff training, and knowledgeable and patient-centered care. The guide also explains how pharmacies can implement these in practice.
