### Annual General Meeting Vote Results

Prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM), College Council (Council) received a Member motion regarding the levy to the College of Pharmacy, Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Manitoba, for consideration at the meeting.

In order to be as inclusive as possible, Council decided to conduct an electronic vote prior to the AGM. The poll was carried out from April 4 to April 25, 2019. Eligible voting members were able to cast a ballot at any time during this 22 day period.

The Motion read:

*MOVED by Christin Franken, SECONDED by Schalk Strydom*

*"THAT commencing with the 2020 licensing year, the College of Pharmacists of Manitoba supports a change in the mandatory \$100.00 fee (levy) historically charged to each member of the College to a voluntary donation of \$100.00 or of a magnitude as chosen by each member individually, which voluntary donation is to be forwarded to the College of Pharmacy, Faculty*
