

- Your naloxone purchase should include: At least 2 doses 0.4 mg/ml naloxone At least 2 retractable VanishPoint® syringes

## What is naloxone and why do you need it?

Naloxone is an antidote to opioid overdose. Taking too much of opioid drugs (like morphine, oxycodone, methadone, heroin, or fentanyl) can slow or stop breathing. Naloxone restores consciousness in 1 - 5 minutes of use. Giving naloxone can prevent death or brain damage from lack of oxygen during an opioid overdose.

Pinch nose. Cover mouth with mask or clothing Tilt head back to open the airway. Breathing can slow down during an overdose but Ventilate Evaluate Airway Muscular Injection Evaluate Stimulate the heart is probably still Unresponsive? CALL 911 1 breath every 5 seconds 1st dose of naloxone 2nd dose? beating - Give breaths to keep them alive How to Use Naloxone Flip off the cap Turn vial Inject into muscle to reveal latex upside down seal Press plunger all the way Pull plunger to down to trigger safety draw up liquid (retraction)
