Purpose

To outline the College of Pharmacists of Manitoba (CPhM) eligibility requirements and limitations for sitting the CPhM Jurisprudence Exam (JP Exam).

Policy

1. The CPhM JP Exam is based on the [CPhM Jurisprudence Exam Blueprint](#).
2. All pharmacist and pharmacy technician candidates for registration and licensure, or listing, must successfully complete the CPhM JP Exam as a requirement for licensure or listing with CPhM.
3. Individuals are eligible to write the CPhM JP Exam once their registration or listing application and supporting documents have been approved by the Registrar, and they have submitted proof of completing the Pharmacy Jurisprudence Modules to CPhM¹.
4. Candidates must not be in a conflict of interest with the JP Exam proctor, whether actual, perceived or potential.
5. Candidates must not disclose any examination items or content to others in any format. Any evidence of disclosure, dishonesty, or cheating will result in referral to the CPhM Registrar for further action.
6. All candidates who require reasonable accommodation for disabilities to sit the JP Exam in accordance with the [Manitoba Human Rights Code](#) are required to provide a written request to CPhM no less than eight (8) weeks prior to the examination date.
7. Candidates may only take the exam four (4) times in any 24-month period. After a candidate's third unsuccessful attempt, they are required to follow up with a registration advisor for guidance on remediation.
8. Should a candidate be unsuccessful at the JP Exam, they must wait at least 4 weeks between each additional attempt.
9. A successful JP Exam result expires after two years from the exam date. The JP Exam must be successfully completed by individuals returning to practice after an absence of three or more years.

¹ Students at the College of Pharmacy, Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Manitoba complete the modules during the PharmD program and become eligible to write the JP Exam in the fourth year of the PharmD program.

Fee Structure

The JP Exam fees are in accordance with the publicly available CPhM Fee Schedule.
